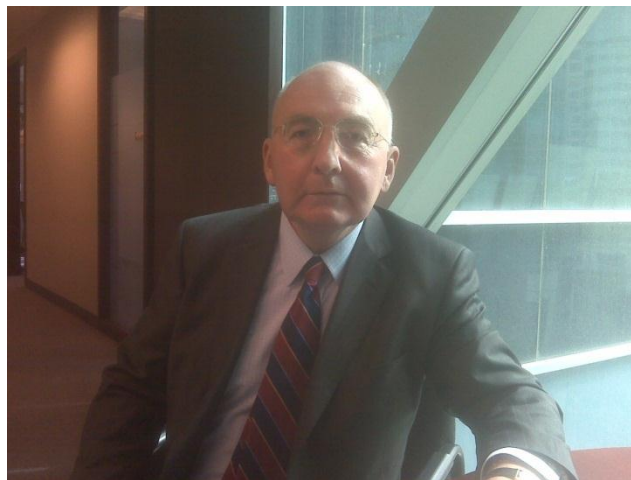

ALLAN MACLURE



For all the dedication, loyalty, efforts, and because of the importance of the work that Mr. Maclure has done as Chair of the Membership and Admissions Committee since 2007, the Law Society of Nunavut is pleased to name Allan Maclure as the Volunteer of the Year.

Since 2007, Mr. Maclure has put in countless hours leading the Membership and Admissions Committee, reviewing every application for membership to the Society, flagging areas of concerns, conducting investigations, and recommending solutions. All has been done as a volunteer, and all while a non-resident of the jurisdiction.

Mr. Maclure has been a member of the LSN since the very beginning, in 1999 (having joined NWT in 1998). He was legal counsel with Nunavut Tunngavik Inc. for several years he then moved to Toronto to work for the Federal Department of Justice then within the last few years moved to the Government of Alberta all the while maintaining his membership in Nunavut and his role in the regulation of the legal profession in the North.

The Membership and Admissions Committee serves an important function for the Society. The main role of the Law Societies is in credentialing and disciplining - Credentialing is sometimes the “poor cousin” of these two roles, as there often is not a lot of fanfare associated with the decisions of the committee. However, ensuring proper credentials and character at the outset of membership is the real safeguard for the public to ensure that the public is represented by competent, ethical practitioners deserving of the public's trust.
