

Pursuant to S. 18 of the *Legal Profession Act*, a person is qualified for admission to the Law Society when;

(a) they have been duly called to the bar of a province or a territory or has been admitted to practise as an attorney, advocate, barrister or solicitor in any superior court of a province or territory; and

(b) is of good character and of good standing in the law society of the province or territory of which he or she is an attorney, advocate, barrister or solicitor.

If you meet these criteria you will be able to apply for one of our three membership types, depending on your credentials. Regular Membership, Canadian Legal Advisor or a Restricted Appearance Certificate. If you are applying for Regular Membership or a Canadian Legal Advisor, after your application is approved by the Executive you will have 1 year to take your Oath.

Regardless of whether you are applying for Regular Membership, Canadian Legal Advisor or a Restricted Appearance Certificate you will need to complete and submit the Combined Application Forms.
